In April of 1912 when the Titanic sank in the North Atlantic Ocean, more than 1,500 people died. The irony is that most of the lifeboats went out from the Titanic only partially full. Many believed that the ship could not sink and that they would not die. It did, and they did.

6. Jesus confronted the woman directly with the fact that He was the Messiah. How can we do so?
