The Argument

- If you were slaves but now you have been made sons, why on Earth would you <u>be</u> <u>willingly</u> to go back to being slaves?
- In other words, if you were in *bondage* BUT NOW you have been *set free*, why on Earth would you **be willing** to go back to being in bondage?

Desiring vs. Deserving

- The "folly" of the Galatians is that they have been tricked ("bewitched") into *desiring* to be enslaved to "weak and beggarly elements"
 - **Jews:** the Law
 - Gentiles: other Pagan religions
 - **Both:** works-based, external righteousness
- Prodigal in Luke 15 "I don't deserve"
 - Not worthy to be called your son
 - Make me like a slave

Legalism's appeal

- Perceived authority Charming, convincing arguments based on Scripture
- Cultural pressure No one wants to be an outsider.
 We want to belong and/or fit in
- *Nit-picking Strict adherence to God's laws gives us the "right" to hold claim to our status as "sons"
- Superiority A sense of pride of doing things "better" than other people/groups

Paul's appeal

Become like me

- Forsaking <u>institutional righteousness</u> in exchange for <u>righteousness</u> by faith in Christ
- "count all things loss for the excellence of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord" – Philippians 3:8

Why should they listen?

Because Paul became like them

Paul's approach

• "In seeking to win other people for Christ, our end is to make them like us, while the means to that end is to make ourselves like them. If they are to become one with us in Christian conviction and experience, we must first become *one with them* in Christian compassion." – John Stott

Paul's confusion

- You did me no harm (v. 12b)
- Did not reject me, even though I was sick (v. 14a)
- Received me as an angel of God (v. 14b)
- Would have plucked our your own eyes for me (v. 15)
- Am I now your enemy? (v. 16)
- Did I labor in vain? (v. 11)

Judaizers vs. Paul

FALSE TEACHERS

- They do not want what's best for you (17a)
- They want you keep you from me (17b)
- Treat you based on whose around (18)

PAUL

- I want to see Christ formed in you (19)
- I want to be present with you now (20)
- I labor in birth pains again (19)

Concluding thoughts

Knowing and being known by God

 Intimacy (i.e. a reciprocal love relationship) with God is the essence of eternal life

Truth comes from God, not men.

 Galatians turned on Paul once they did not like his message

Christ is our preoccupation

False teachers want you to be <u>preoccupied with them</u>.
 Paul wanted the Galatians to be <u>preoccupied with</u>
 <u>Christ</u>
