

1 Corinthians 1:2-9

The Greek word for Church: ekklésia

- Original Word: ἐκκλησία, ας, ἡ
- Definition of ekklésia: an assembly, congregation, church
 - ek, "out from and to" and
 - kaléō, "to call"
- Properly put, Ekklesia means: people called out from the world and to God, the outcome being the Church, the mystical body of Christ.

What does it mean to get proximate?

- We have to get proximate to people who are suffering
- When you get close to people that are marginalized, you understand nuances and begin figuring things out
- Leadership requires that the people we are leading know that we care for them
- Caring means we need to find ways to get close. Have in-person conversations.




